SEWARD HIGHWAY: MP 25.5 to 36, Trail River to Sterling Wye, **Pavement Preservation**

Project No. 0311035/CFHWY00301

Project Scope

The State of Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT&PF), in cooperation with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), is proposing to resurface the Seward Highway from milepost (MP) 25.5 (near the Trail River bridge) to MP 36 (near the Sterling Wye). This project includes overlaying and/or milling and filling the existing pavement on the Seward Highway; and may also include, as necessary: improvement to lighting, signals and/or beacons, guardrail, storm drain cleaning, replacing and/or repairing culverts, vegetation clearing, digging out and replacing degraded roadway embankment, repair of automated traffic recorders, improvements to pedestrian facilities not meeting current Americans with Disabilities Act guidelines, drainage improvements, signs, and striping. The purpose of this project is to eliminate ruts, extend the surface life of the roadway, and reduce maintenance costs. The traveling public will receive the safety benefits of a rut free pavement surface, new pavement markings, improved guardrail, and signage.

A future project within the same limits, Seward Highway MP 25.5 to 36, Trail River to Sterling Wye, Rehabilitation, will rehabilitate the roadway and make more extensive improvements such as widening shoulders and straightening curves.

Current Status

Preliminary design work and environmental analysis is underway.

Preliminary Design – Fall 2017 to Fall 2018 Final Design - Fall 2018 to Spring 2019 Construction - Summer 2019*
